Journalist Matthew Caruana Galizia will deliver testimony on his family's pursuit of justice for his mother, the Maltese journalist Daphne Caruana Galizia, who was murdered in 2017. Hatice Cengiz, the fiancee of Saudi Arabian journalist Jamal Khashoggi, delivers testimony on the obstacles to accountability for the murder of Jamal in the Saudi consulate in Istanbul in 2018. Christophe Deloire's testimony covers the findings of Reporters Without Borders (RSF) concerning press freedom and the impact of impunity for press freedom worldwide. Joel Simon delivers testimony on behalf of the Committee to Protect Journalists, which has tracked impunity for attacks on the press since 1992. Fatou Jagne Senghore will deliver expert testimony on the safety of journalists and obstacles to justice with a specific focus on West-Africa. Ms Carrillo and Ms Gallagher have represented families and organizations in cases concerning the (investigation of) the murder of a journalist. Nadim Houry is a human rights lawyer and member of the High Level Panel of Legal Experts, and will testify on the findings of his Panel on the legal obstacles to justice for journalists who are murdered in reprisal of their work.
